A 30 year advocate for nursing home residents and families, Ms. Burger continues to work on developing and implementing policy and speaking on a range of issues, including nurse-aide training, nurse staffing, resident assessment, physical restraint and bedrail elimination, and chemical restraint reduction.

Sarah Burger joined NCCNHR in 1987 and worked in a variety of roles and responsibilities including Executive Director and Associate for Program and Policy. Prior to joining NCCNHR, Ms Burger completed a two-year retrospective chart review of The Autumn Hills Nursing Home and was an expert witness for the Attorney General of Texas in that case. Mrs. Burger was also the Project Coordinator for six model projects using trained community volunteers as advocates in nursing home complaint resolution under an AoA grant.
